RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS . . .

"Summertime, and the living is easy"

Many of you will recognize the above words as the opening line of the song *Summertime* from the 1935 American opera "Porgy and Bess." There are over 25,000 recordings of this song by a wide range of artists including Billie Holliday, Louis Armstrong, Miles Davis, The Marcels, Janis Joplin, and The Zombies. Not that it ever went away, but the song is having a bit of a resurgence with the recent Broadway revival of the opera.

Well, the sentiments of the song aside, the living has been anything but easy so far this summer. In the June newsletter I wrote about how it had been hot around here lately. What I didn't know at the time was how hot or for how long we would be challenged by the weather. The extreme heat has caused a great deal of misery for people, not just here in Delaware but across much of our land. Coupled with summer storms, dry conditions and wildfires, places like Colorado and Montana have suffered the loss of lives and homes.

It can be easy for any of us, as we leave town for a few days or a few weeks, to become less mindful of the day-to-day, week-to-week ministries and worship that are being carried out "back home" or around the country. Our ministry as Christians to respond to the needs of others neither takes a vacation nor is limited to certain seasons of the year. Even during the summer months there is the need to stay connected with our calling to love one another as God loves us. Even when away we can respond by sending donations to relief agencies and, of course, to remember to pray for the needs of others as you become aware of them.

Closing of the Cathedral

The Cathedral Church of St. John will hold its final worship service on July 29th. This is a sad and difficult time for the congregation who desperately hoped to continue their ministry in that part of the City of Wilmington. Please continue to hold them up in your prayers. Many of the people will be joining other parishes and the urban Episcopal churches will be meeting to explore ways to go forward in ministry. In August we will be given the 'St. James' Millcreek' kneeler that was used in the main nave of the Cathedral (see the photo below). We will find a place to proudly display the kneeler in honor of the faith and life of the people of St. John's.

Ronald McDonald House of DE - Pop Tabs

763 Pop Tabs equal one pound (they counted!). After the tabs are collected, the local RMHC Chapter brings the collection to local recycling centers, where they are weighed to determine their value (values can vary significantly). The recycling center then sends the local RMHC Chapter a check for the total value. The average cost to host a family for one night is \$85. Families are asked to pay \$25 per night if they canno one is turned away for inability to pay.

St James' Mission/Outreach committee coordinates our efforts at collecting these tabs and periodically taking them to our local Ronald McDonald House. It's an easy way we can all help others and the environment.

Comprised of 25 voices, accompanied by two organ scholars and led by Director Sarah MacDonald, the choir will present music of English composers with a Cambridge connection. The program, titled "My Beloved Spake" will feature works of Byrd, Tallis, Dering, C.V. Stanford, Patrick Hadley, Charles Wood, Giles Swayne, Gerald Finzi, and Paul Mealor.

Selwyn College is one of 31 colleges at Cambridge University, and the chapel choir has led services since the founding of Selwyn in 1882. The choir has been heard on BBC radio, as well as concerts and services throughout the UK, recently singing in Westminster Abbey and St. Paul's Cathedral. The regularly scheduled meeting of the Vestry of St. James Church Mill Creek was called to order at 7:15 pm. Fr. Jim led the Vestry in an opening prayer.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Approved

TREASURER'S REPORT: Steve Prescott presented the Treasurer's Report. So far this year the spending rate is in line with previous years. A motion was made and approved to fund the concrete work from the Memorial Fund.

Sam White would like to be relieved of her duties as Disbursing Treasurer. Steve Prescott and Bruce Vrana will contact members to see if they are interested in taking over the duties. They hope to have someone by the July Vestry Meeting.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Thank You Notes: Thank you notes will be sent to Valerie Bragg and Cynde Bimbi thanking them for all their hard work to make SMACA a success.

Civil Unions: This will be on the Vestry Retreat Agenda. General Convention will be taking this up in July. After that each diocese will discuss it.

Family Promise: Sr. Warden, Bruce Vrana, will meet with Family Promise to finalize the new contract.

Vestry Retreat: A motion was made and approved to defer the retreat until September or early October. September 8th and October 6th are dates being considered.

NEW BUSINESS:

Parochial Report: This is an annual report that each church is required to submit. It consists of the number of members, attendance numbers and financial information. A motion was made and approved to approve the 2011 Parochial Report. The Vestry members signed the report. Once the report is submitted the Financial Advisory Committee can apply for grant money.

Tercentennial Fundraising/Donations: At this time there is no procedure for who approves expenditures and how we raise funds for the Tercentennial. The Tercentennial Committee (TC) needs to prioritize what expenditures they are proposing. The Vestry's role is to ensure a control and continuity for any fund raising activities.

Fr. Jim will meet with Fran Mayhew, Chairperson of the TC, before the July Vestry Meeting.

Keith St. John, Music Director, has submitted a list of suggested Tercentennial Music Plans. Volunteers are doing all the work in the cemetery. Fr. Jim has been researching the purchase of a new frontal but at this time no decision has been made.

OTHER ISSUES:

Some parishioners have expressed concern that decisions are being made but the information is not being shared with the congregation. Vestry members were reminded that when they are confronted by parishioners they should ask them if they have talked to Fr. Jim or Bruce Vrana. They are both always available to discuss any concerns parishioners have.

VESTRY GREETER REPORTS:

The Vestry Greeter Schedule was reviewed. Gail Zimmerman gave a brief report on new attendees.

RECTOR'S REPORT:

Vacation Bible School: VBS will be held July 16 to July 20 from 9am – Noon.

Bible Challenge: The 90 Day Challenge is going great and is very exciting. More people are still being added. There are now more than 60 participants.

St. Barnabas: St. Barnabas' Church has just come through a difficult time in the life of the parish. Several years ago a complaint was filed by a member of the congregation against their rector and after a Church Court trial and several appeals a sentence was handed down on May 29th. He will be suspended 3 years for Conduct Unbecoming a Member of the Clergy and 5 years for Violation of Ordination Vows. The suspensions will run concurrently. There have been no other complaints about clergy in the diocese in the last 3 years.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

WORSHIP: Celebrating Pentecost Sunday along with Memorial Day was well received. Simplifying the Second Service during the summer months is being considered.

PROPERTY: Did not meet.

FINANCE: The FAC met before Memorial Day Weekend. They are researching what funds are available through the Advance & Development Committee. The Committee provides assistance to parishes throughout the state. The FAC will be assigned a liaison from the Committee. It will assist the FAC with their proposal. The procedure requires a lot of paper work. The FAC will stay active all summer working with the liaison to complete the proposal.

The FAC will send an informational letter to the congregation. Fr. Jim will follow that letter with an inspirational letter. It is hoped that the letters will go out by early August.

PARISH LIFE: Nothing new to report

TERCENTENNIAL/HISTORY: This was covered in the NEW BUSINESS discussion.

MISSSION/OUTREACH/FAMILY PROMISE: Family Promise starts June 24th. Sign-up sheets have been posted.

A number of special gifts have been received for the Food Closet. The food shelves, however, are bare and there is also a need for hygiene items. One of our area homeless people was beaten up and his things were taken.

Gail Zimmerman explained about collecting POP TABS for the Ronald McDonald House.

763 Pop Tabs = 1 lb. The rate is \$0.38 per pound. The money earned is used to offset the cost of a family's stay.

EDUCATION: Recognition Sunday went well. Valerie Bragg is resigning as Sunday School Chairperson after 4 years of service. We are in need of a new chairperson.

SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT:

The Vestry received a letter from a parishioner stating that he was not in favor of Morning Prayer. This is something that Fr. Jim and the Vestry will take into consideration.

OTHER BUSINESS:

New Vestry members would like an update of what has been discussed previously regarding Civil Unions and other topics to be covered at the Retreat.

There being no further business, the Vestry meeting concluded at 9:05 pm with the Order of Compline.

THE WAY, THE TRUTH, THE LIFE


Play this game with a group of friends to remind you to follow Jesus.

What you do:

- 1. Using jump ropes or traffic cones, form lines at both ends of the playing area. Also make a dividing line in the middle. Designate one side as "The Way" and the other as "The Truth." The center line is "The Life."
- 2. Choose one person to stand in the middle of the center line. He or she is the caller, yelling, "The way!" or "The truth!" or "The life!" The rest of the players also start on the middle line.
